i. **Update on Town Centre Signs.**

It was reported that the signs have been received and were on display around the community.

ii. **Town Centre Wi-Fi.**

The Committee was advised that there was a doubt whether this element could be included in the CCBC Resilience Grant. However, the merits of this scheme to the community were explored.

RESOLVED: To recommend to Council that Town Centre Wi-Fi be established by the Council.

iii. **Fixed Canopies.**

The benefits of fix canopies over retractable ones were discussed.

RESOLVED: To explore the cost and feasibility of establishing fixed canopies in the area.

iv. **Design of Retractable Awnings.**

A discussion on the exact design of the retractable awning was deferred to allow for more information to be obtained.

89/20 Amendment to CCBC Resilience Grant.

The Committee was advised that while an application to CCBC's Resilience Grant had been submitted, containing elements that were believed to be within the verbal guidelines received, the assessment department were now rejecting some aspects. However, CCBC is willing to allow the Committee to amend its application to closer match the published examples.

RESOLVED: To challenge CCBC's rejection of some elements of the grant, while preparing an amended application to only contain the elements that are being accepted.
